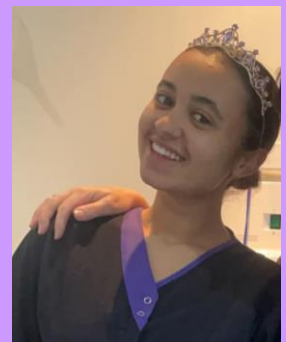

In the UK, over £1 billion is spent on Halloween sweets and chocolate annually

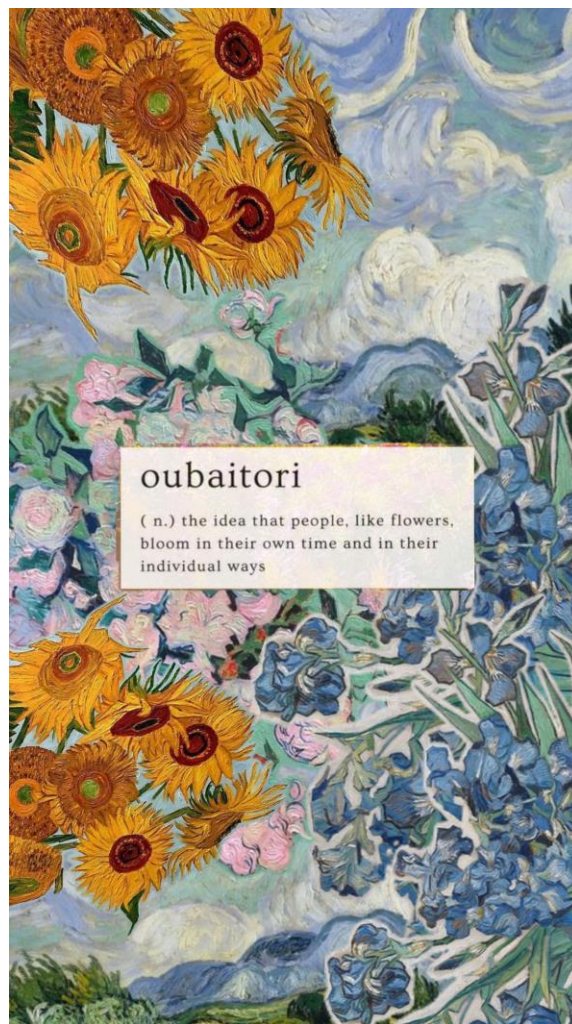
Snickers is the most popular Halloween sweet in the UK

It has been suggested that children may be consuming up to 384g of sugar on Halloween – 16 times the recommended daily limit.

The first line of defence should always be reducing the frequency of sugar intake, avoid very sticky and chewy sweets to reduce the risk of sugar sticking to teeth for a long period of time, rather than snacking on sweets throughout the day, spread them out over a number of days, or enjoy them after a meal to reduce the impact on their teeth. But, most importantly, ensure your children are still maintaining their oral hygiene routines.
